After spending a year in Tokyo, testing the waters of life in the capital, I decided to break the language barrier by attending a language school.

For a while, I felt like I was stuck at the bottom of a mountain. But the teachers had my back. The school had its own original textbooks that were written by veteran instructors and a great method to help us learn. Teachers felt responsible for the

students. Instructors knew exactly (4) they were doing and how to lead us to our goals.

A few years and a baby later, I am facing new language challenges. But thanks to the guidance of amazing people in that year in school, I am finding my way in (5)the mountain of the Japanese language.
